modern Jewish culture for the Museum of the History of Polish Jews.



Beth Wenger, Ph. D is Professor of History at the University of Pennsylvania. She is Chair of the History Department and Director of the Jewish Studies Program. Her most recent book is *History Lessons: The Creation of American Jewish Heritage* (Princeton Press, 2010). Wenger holds a B.A. from Wesleyan University, M.A.s from Columbia University

and the Jewish Theological Seminary, and a Ph.D. From Yale University. She serves as historical consultant to the National Museum of American Jewish History and as Chair of the Academic Council of the American Historical Society.



Ethel G. Hofman, D. Univ is a nationally syndicated columnist. She contributes to Gastronomica, Cooking Pleasures, Philadelphia Jewish Exponent. Ms. Hofman was President of the International Association of Culinary Professionals from 1995-1996. She received an Honorary Doctorate, June 2011, from Caldonian University,

Glasgow, Scotland. Her most recent book is *Mackerel at Midnight-growing up Jewish on a remote Scottish Island* was published in March, 2005 (Camino Books) and in the U.K. by Mercat Press in November, 2006.


